

Scorpius - The Scorpion





Did you know?

- Scorpius (which means Scorpion in Latin) is one of the 12 zodiac constellations, located in the southern celestial hemisphere and one of the 42 constellations that represents an animal.
- There are two meteor showers associated with the constellation of Scorpius: the Alpha Scorpiids and the Omega Scorpiids.
- In the Northern hemisphere, the constellation can be seen in July and August and, in the Southern, from March to October.
- At the heart of Scorpius is Antares, one of the brightest stars in the night sky. The constellation has 14 stars with planets.
- It is one of the oldest known constellations, as the Sumerians also called it Gir-Tab or Scorpion 5000 years ago.
 - In Greek mythology, Scorpius represents a scorpion that was placed in the heavens after being killed by the great hunter, Orion.
