

Libra: The scales





Did you know?

- Libra is the seventh constellation of the zodiac and is located in the southern celestial hemisphere.
- In Latin, Libra is the name for weighing scales. The stars Alpha and Beta Librae represent the balance beam, while Gamma and Sigma are the weighing pans.
 - Libra is the only constellation in the zodiac that represents an object, and not an animal or a character from mythology.
- The sun enters Libra during the Autumn Equinox on September 21 when the days and nights are of equal length.
- Beta Librae, also known as Zubeneschamali, is the brightest star in the constellation.
