> Ganges Shark he International Union HABITAT AND ECOLOGY: for Conservation of Wetlands (inland), Marine Nature's Red List of Neritic Threatened Species, NUMBER OF MATURE established in 1964, has **INDIVIDUALS:** become the world's most comprehensive information 240 source on the global conservation status of animal, fungi, and plant species. Species are assessed against five criteria based on geographic range, population size, and population decline/increase. In addition to extinction probability analyses, species in the Vulnerable, Endangered, and Critically Endangered categories are collectively described as threatened. Here are a few of them.
